

Tuxedo Park Resident Who Helped Win WWII



Tuxedo Park's Secret Laboratory of Alfred Loomis



President Roosevelt praised the value of Loomis's work, describing him as being the civilian who was second only to Churchill, in facilitating the Allied victory in World War II


Throughout the years, he traded vast sums of money on the financial market during the week, in the evenings and weekends he worked with the world's greatest scientists at his own secret laboratory in Tuxedo Park. In the early 1920s, Alfred Lee Loomis and his staff conducted experiments in sound waves, spectrometry and precise time measurements. He was credited with the inventions of the Aberdeen chronometer, a microscope centrifuge, and a pressurized fire extinguisher. In 1928, anticipating the coming Wall Street Crash of 1929, he, his partner, and his firm had converted their investments into cash, having determined that the market had risen so dramatically that it was unsustainable and a crash was inevitable.

Once the stock market crash had bankrupted the majority of speculators, and Wall Street floundered, he and his firm became extremely wealthy as a result of purchasing stocks cheaply after they had plummeted in value, and few people had the cash to reinvest.

From the late 1920s through the 1930s Loomis and renowned scientists performed successful research at his Tuxedo Park laboratory. Besides working on ultrasonics; he collaborated with Newton Harvey on electrical signals in the brain and heart. His Tuxedo Park laboratory was nicknamed the "Tower House and, The Palace of Science"

Loomis's own radar studies, coupled with his money and influence, being a first cousin to Henry Stimson, Secretary of War in both World Wars, made him an ideal choice to head the NDRC's Microwave Radar Project. It was in that capacity that Loomis hosted the British scientists who brought the cavity magnetron to Tuxedo Park. Loomis later worked closely with FDR and his administration in preparing the country's technological base for war. Using his many contacts in New York finance, and with generous sums from his own considerable fortune, he financed the early developments in radar before government money could be provided. President Roosevelt praised the value of Loomis's work, describing him as being the civilian who was second only to Churchill, in facilitating the Allied victory in World War II.

Tuxedo Park's Augustus Juilliard

Augustus Juilliard is best remembered as the music lover and philanthropist who donated the funds for the Juilliard School of Music in New York City. He resided in Tuxedo Park, where he owned a grand mansion with sprawling lawns and stables. The stables boasted over 5,000 square feet. Both the home and stables were architecturally world-class.


In 1866 he worked in the garment industry for a textile manufacturing company that produced worsted fabrics. When the company went bankrupt, Juilliard founded his own corporation. He became successful and wealthy, and added to his fortune through investments and board appointments in banking, railroad and insurance.

He served as President of the Metropolitan Opera for nearly three decades. In 1924, his Foundation's funds were used to establish the Juilliard Graduate School, to assist excelling students with an advanced music education. He loved living in Tuxedo Park, and according to the book, "The World With a Fence Around It" by George Rushmore, Juilliard had many friends who enjoyed his company, wisdom, and progressive ideas in the world of music. Augustus Juilliard is buried at St. Mary's Church in Tuxedo Park.

Tuxedo Park's Grenville Kane

Tuxedo Park's Grenville Kane began collecting in 1912 and collected some of the rarest literature in the world. The great grandson of John Jacob Astor, Mr. Kane served as treasurer, governor, and prominent participant in all of Tuxedo Park's social events. His Americana holdings included three editions of "The Columbus Letters" that existed in his library. These were direct correspondences regarding the maritime discoveries of Christopher Columbus.

When Christopher Columbus married the daughter of an Italian navigator, the daughter and Columbus received all of her father's valuable charts as a wedding gift. Arming himself with these charts, Columbus started on his daring enterprises. Rare pages from Columbus's original correspondence from these journeys were in Grenville Kane's collection in Tuxedo Park.

These papers were a clear indication of Columbus's vast obstacles. From the superstitious sailors to the prejudices of educated men, and general geographical ignorance.

It was said that being in Grenville Kane's library in his home in Tuxedo Park, was like entering a fantasy world of literature. A rich sensation overtook you, with the scent of wooden bookcases polished to a gloss that cradled some of the rarest literature in the world. There was a far-end window in the library that glanced out onto the formal gardens. And as you sat in the chair near that window absorbing yourself within the educational assemblage of literature, everything but that world, simply vanished. Grenville Kane's eye for rare material was astute, however, throughout his years of collecting, he managed to bring forward the light of life from yesterday, to the yearning for knowledge and the appreciation of history, through to today.



Henry Poor was a successful Wall Street speculator and senior partner in the banking house of H.W. Poor & Co. He also originated Poor's Manual of Securities in 1894, which became a valuable resource for investors.

Woodland, one of the grandest mansions in Tuxedo Park, where walled gardens were magisteriously laid out encompassing acres, was where Henry Poor, founder of the S&P 500 called home.

The work of Henry Poor, publisher of the American Railroad Journal, and Poor's Manual of Securities, caused dramatic changes in the relationship between companies and journalists. Henry Poor was one of the first true journalists who focused on forcing companies to provide accurate information about their financial performance to investors and readers. Poor's activities in publishing the "Manual of the Railroads of the United States", helped set the standard for journalists writing about business.

The Journal did not merely recite statistics of fees and wages to transport goods across certain railroad lines, instead, it functioned more like a traditional newspaper of the time period, with articles and reports about the industry. It also provided a healthy amount of engineering and technical information of those operating railroads.

While Poor spent much time in the first few years of the publication advocating for the industry, he did so with a solid economic knowledge that explained the advantages of the railroad. He also paid particular attention to attracting investors of railroad stocks and bonds to the publication.





TUXEDO PARK'S GEORGE JAY GOULD



THE MEN WHO MOVED RAILROADS

One of Tuxedo Park families, the Gould family, moved railroads and communication. Jay Gould, and his son George, were two of the shrewdest businessmen in American history. During a time when well-moneyed families such as the Astor's, Morgan's, and the Vanderbilt's controlled fortunes of Wall Street, Jay Gould, and his son, George, controlled the communications of the United States through the ownership and control of Western Union and several other telegraph companies.

Jay Gould was a leading American railroad developer and speculator who has been referred to as one of the ruthless robber barons of the Gilded Age, whose success at business made him one of the richest men of his era. George worked for his father, foregoing a higher education for a Wall Street position which his father bought for him when he turned 21. George was granted seats on the boards of various companies and became president of a handful of railroads and about an equal number of telegraph companies.

The Gould's won what was known as the "Erie Railroad War" with Cornelius Vanderbilt. At the time these men operated, there were no laws against their tenacious methods. They knew the angles of obtaining wealth and in many cases acted before anyone else did. Upon Jay Gould's death, Tuxedo Park Resident, George Jay Gould, inherited the major portion of the Gould fortune and received all of his father's railroad holdings.







Tuxedo Park's, Robert Goelet's ancestors owned huge tracts of land in Manhattan since the late 1700's. They began as ironmongers during the American Revolution, and were second only to the Astors in terms of the value of real estate owned in Manhattan.

Having a beautiful home in Tuxedo Park, and being a prominent member of the Tuxedo Club, Robert Goelet also built an enormous estate on eight thousand acres and a 23,000 sq.ft. mansion in Chester, NY which was, and still is, known as Glenmere. It was there that the first Retriever Field Trial in America was actually conducted under British rules on December 21, 1931. Wealthy Eastern U.S. estate owners imported labradors from the British Isles in those days, along with the kennel men to train them. These were competitive events that showcased a dog's natural hunting instincts and training, particularly for retrieving, pointing, and flushing game.

They were designed to mimic a real hunting scenario and judge a dog's performance in areas like finding, retrieving, and delivering game. Glenmere Estate was one of the finest for these events.

Robert Goelet was one of the original stockholders in The Metropolitan Opera House and a director of many business organizations. He was also a director of numerous trust companies, such as the Equitable Trust Co. and the Guaranty Trust Co. and also appears on a list of "1912 Money Trust Members" as having seven interlocking directorships.

Until the formation of the Federal Reserve System and the Security & Exchange Commission, it was the banks and trust companies that unofficially set the monetary policy in the United States, which in turn allowed them to determine the rates, terms and conditions that affected the all-important liquidity that impacted Wall Street. And it was the directors of these banks, and trust companies who formulated these policies. Mr. Goelet was one of these directors.



TUXEDO PARK'S DOROTHY DRAPER

*The country's finest
interior designer*



Dorothy Draper was born into a wealthy and privileged family in 1889, in one of the most exclusive communities in American history, Tuxedo Park. She was the first to “professionalize” the interior design industry by establishing, in 1923, the first interior design company in the United States, Dorothy Draper & Company. Something that until then was unheard of, and also at a time when it was considered daring for a woman to go into business for herself.

She revolutionized the concept of design by breaking away from the historical period room styles that dominated the work of her predecessors and contemporaries. As an artist she was a modern, one of the first decorators of the breed, and a pioneer. She invented “Modern Baroque”, a style that had particular application to large public spaces and modern architecture.

She was born into the upper-class Tuckerman family in Tuxedo Park, NY, one of the first gated communities in the United States. Her parents were Paul Tuckerman (1856–1940) and Susan (née Minturn) Tuckerman (1866–1956). In addition to the house in Tuxedo Park, the family had a Manhattan townhouse and a summer cottage in Newport, RI. Her niece, Nancy Tuckerman, was the 12th White House Social Secretary who was appointed by Jackie Kennedy.

Educated primarily at home by a governess and tutors, Draper spent two years at the Brearley School in New York City. The family took yearly trips to Europe, and she was a debutante in 1907.

The atmosphere of Tuxedo Park triggered many legendary icons. Many came to the park because of their social positions, and many developed, and inspired the rest of the world, because of it.
